1999 Washington Promise Scholarship

An overview from the Higher Education Coordinating Board - May 1999



The 1999 Legislature and Governor Gary Locke created a new college scholarship program for low- and middle-income students who achieve an excellent academic record throughout their high school careers. For 1999, the scholarship is available to graduating high school students in the top 10% of their senior class who meet certain family income limits. The scholarship will be available this fall and may be renewed for one additional year. There is no guarantee that the scholarships will be available after June 30, 2001. Students should apply for and use these funds prior to June 30, 2001.

Who Is Eligible?

To be eligible you must meet these criteria:

- 1. Be designated by your high school as in the top 10% of the 1999 graduating senior class.
- 2. Have a family income that is equal to or less than 135% of the state's median. See the income chart below.
- 3. Attend an accredited public or private university, college or other accredited post-secondary institution in the state of Washington.

What Are the Income Cutoffs?

To qualify for the monetary award, your family income must be equal to or less than the income cutoffs on this chart. The number of family members means the number of people for whom your parent(s) or guardian(s) provide more than one-half of the support.

How Much is the Award Worth? Can It Be Renewed?

The value of the award depends on how many eligible students qualify for the scholarship. The maximum award is \$1,585 per year. The exact value of this year's award will be determined around mid-September 1999. The scholarship may be renewed for one additional year, but does not extend beyond June 30, 2001.

How Do I Apply? When Will I know if I Qualify?

To apply simply complete the application on the back of this fact sheet and return it to the Higher Education Coordinating Board. We encourage you to return the application as soon as possible, but it must be received by the deadline of <u>September 1, 1999</u>. Students who qualify will be notified this fall. The first disbursements will be available during the fall term.

How will my family's income be verified?

The family income must be verified. Please enclose a photocopy of page 1 and page 2 of your parent(s) 1998 federal tax return form (1040/1040A/1040EZ) with the application. If no tax return has been filed, please call the Higher Education Coordinating Board to request an "income verification" form.

As you know the Washington Promise Scholarship program is beginning its first year of operation. The program will soon be ready to disburse funds to eligible students. Approximately 2,300 students will receive awards in 1999-2000. The scholarships will be worth \$1,125 for this academic year. Schools will be able to begin requesting funds as early as October 1.

Starting today, schools may access a list of eligible students posted to the password-protected section of the Board's website. As of today there are over 2,100 eligible students. We estimate that an additional 200 students will establish their eligibility within the next few weeks. list is updated in real time, as students are approved.

The web address is http://www.hecb.wa.gov/hecblogin/login.asp http://www.hecb.wa.gov/hecblogin/login.asp>> . This is the same site where the Board has begun placing its SNG Archive List and the SWS Employer list. Remember this address because there is no link to it from the HECH home page.

The site requires the user to register. If you have not already registered you must do so on your first visit. It will take a less than one business day before you are approved for access. If you have already registered, but do not find a link to the Promise Scholarship materials after logging-on, then you did not request, or were not granted permission to access that particular program. If this is the case please send me an email or call me at (360) 753-7851.

After you have logged-in click the link to the Promise Scholarship program. You will be offered the opportunity to "filter' the list by student, school, or date. This allows you to request just one student, or a list of students who indicated that they intended to enroll at your school, or in subsequent visits, to select only the new entries to the list. You may also request the complete list of all students by placing a "*" in the student SSN/Name field and selecting all institutions. This option, however, may take several minutes to complete, depending upon your computer and download speed.

Once you have the list of students you may "block and copy" it to a more convenient application such as WORD or EXCEL.

Remember that information on this list may be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility for the Promise scholarship program. It may not be used for research purposes. If you have any questions about the proper use of any HECB list made available on the website, please call us at 360-753-7850.

Instructions for claiming payments for eligible WA Promise students and for disbursing the awards will be forthcoming today or tomorrow. In the meantime, if you have other questions about the list, or you have trouble accessing the list, please call me at 360-753-7851.

Instructions for Schools Requesting Funds for Recipients of the Washington Promise Scholarship

The annual value of the 1999-2000 Washington Promise Scholarship award is \$1,125. The award will be paid in equal disbursements per term during the fall semester/quarter, winter quarter and spring semester/quarter. No payments will be made for summer attendance. The fall quarter school payment is \$375. The fall semester payment is \$563.

The school that the recipient is attending must initiate the payment requests. Any student on the list of eligible recipients who is enrolled at least half-time can receive the full award for the term. If a student is enrolled concurrently at two or more schools only the first request will be honored.

This is a password-protected site. If you have not previously received authorization to access the site, you must register on your first visit.

The school's request for payment can be accepted via any one of three formats: paper (least preferred), ASCII file, or EXCEL spreadsheet. A copy of the paper request form and the electronic record layout is enclosed. Institutional payment requests should be sent to:

We prefer to receive the payment requests in an electronic format. The request may be put onto a diskette and mailed to the Board or it may be included as an attachment to an email message. Emailed payment requests should be sent to <a href="mailed-english-engli

All electronic payment requests must include a signed "Certification Statement for Electronically Conveyed Payment Requests." This certification should be enclosed with any diskette. If the request was emailed to the Board, the certification should be immediately sent by U.S. Mail. The Board can not release funds until the certification is received.

The certification requires the school to verify that each student has been matched by the school against the list of eligible students provided by the Board and that the student is enrolled at least half-time. All schools must complete the certification.

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How the Promise Scholarship Will Be Disbursed

The Washington Promise Scholarship is worth \$1,125 for the 1999-2000 academic year. One payment will be made per term until completed. The fall term award at a school that enrolls on the quarter system will be \$375. The fall term award at a semester school will be \$563.

Payments will be made for the fall quarter/semester, the winter quarter, and the spring quarter/semester. There are no disbursements for summer sessions.

In order to receive a payment you must be enrolled for at least six credits (a half-time rate) at an eligible, accredited, institution within the State of Washington. Each participating school and college will have the list of students who are eligible to receive the award. Once the college has confirmed your enrollment, it will request payment of the scholarship from the Higher Education Coordinating Board in Olympia. Payments are made through the student accounts or business office of the college you attend. Schools may request payment of the fall scholarship beginning on October 1, 1999.

If you are attending a public university, community college, or public technical college the school will use the award to pay any remaining tuition or other educational expense you owe to the school. If nothing is owed to the school or if a balance remains after tuition and such is paid, the school will disburse the remainder directly to you.

If you attend a private four-year college or a private technical school, a warrant from the Higher Education Coordinating Board will be given directly to you by the school after a final check on enrollment. If you choose, you may use the warrant to pay for tuition or other educational expenses, but the school may not automatically deduct anything from the warrant. The warrant must be given to you or returned to the Board.

If you enroll in two schools during the same term you will be able to use the scholarship at only one institution. If you transfer to a different eligible college within Washington for the winter or spring terms the scholarship can be transferred to that school.
